On the back is a day by day listing of scripture readings with possible prayer request. Individuals are listed on their day of birth—so that you might pray for them on their birthday. Also on the back is the prayer list for the congregation. Keep on Growing Spiritually!!

READINGS FOR THE DAY:

Habakkuk 1:1-4; 2:1-4: Injustice and violence in the time leading up to the Babylonian exile move this prophet to lament: How can a good and all -powerful God evil in the world and seemingly remain indifferent? God answers by proclaiming that the righteous will live by faith.

<u>II Timothy 1:1-14:</u> This letter written to Timothy is a personal message of encouragement. In the face of hardship and persecution, Timothy is reminded that his faith is a gift of God. He is encouraged to exercise that faith with the help of the Holy Spirit.

<u>Luke 17:5-10:</u> On the way to Jerusalem, Jesus instructs his followers about the power of faith and the duties of discipleship. He calls his disciples to adopt the attitude of servants whose actions are responses to their identity rather than works seeking reward.
