READINGS FOR THE DAY:

<u>Isaiah 63:7-9:</u> God does not delegate divine intervention to a messenger or an angel. God's own presence brings salvation. The prophet and all who red these words join in celebrating God's gracious deeds. God trusts that God's people will not act falsely.

<u>Hebrews 2:10-18:</u> Through Jesus' suffering and death, the trail to eternal salvation has been blazed for us. We do not fear death, because he has conquered the power of death. Thus Christ, our merciful and faithful high priest, has the final say over the destiny of our lives.

<u>Matthew 2:13-23:</u> In a dream, Joseph is warned to flee to Egypt to protect the infant Jesus from the jealousy of Herod.
